

## **Friends of the Pigeon Forge Public Library Scholarship**

The Friends of the Pigeon Forge Public Library scholarship was established to enhance education in the community and interest in the library and its services. The scholarship is open to graduating high school seniors attending Pigeon Forge High School. The deadline to apply for this scholarship is April 26, 2017.

### **Requirements:**

1. Must be a graduating senior from Pigeon Forge High School residing in the service area of the Pigeon Forge Public Library.
2. Student must be eligible for admission into an accredited 4-year college or university, or a 2-year school or technical school at the time of the posted application deadline.
3. Student must timely submit the scholarship application, which can be picked up at Pigeon Forge Public Library, the guidance office of Pigeon Forge High School, or can be found at [www.pfpl.net](http://www.pfpl.net).
4. Student must submit an original essay describing how libraries have helped to achieve academic goals or had an impact on his or her personal life. The essay must be typed with a maximum of 500 words.
5. A high school transcript or equal record of academic performance must be submitted.
6. The applicant should submit 2 letters of recommendation, with at least one from a high school teacher or equivalent.
