- 4. Student must submit an original essay describing how libraries have helped to achieve academic goals or had an impact on his or her personal life. The essay must be typed with a maximum of 500 words.
- 5. A high school transcript or equal record of academic performance must be submitted.
- 6. The applicant should submit 2 letters of recommendation, with at least one from a high school teacher or equivalent.
